Mile One Mission was founded to reach the people of the province of Newfoundland and Labrador with the gospel of Jesus Christ through the planting of churches. Currently there are less than 1% of the population that attend any type of evangelical church. They currently have two church plants in St. John's: Downtown Community Church and Kilbride Community Church and one church plant in Happy Valley-Goose Bay—Northern Cross Community Church.

Please be in prayer for the following:

Northern Cross Community Church: John Lewis will be moving to Happy Valley-Goose Bay January 1st. Pray that he will be able to establish trust with the Indigenous communities and will have doors of opportunity opened for sharing the gospel. The area has a population of 9,000—45% are Anglo, 45% Indigenous and 10% Filipino.

Downtown Community Church: Pray for Adam (and Sabrina) Diamond as he shepherds this congregation. Pray for opportunities to reach into this broken community. There are approximately 10,000 people with no local evangelical church. Pray for stability as they have had to move their place of meeting as they were no longer able to meet in the Community Centre.

Kilbride Community Church: Pray for Matthew and Ruth Lahey as they have just found a permanent place for them to hold Bible Studies and services. Pray for continued growth as this small community has never had an evangelical presence before.

GREETINGS!

Here we are in the month of June. Schools have finished for the year or will be finishing soon. The summer time is ahead of us. Remember, this is a great time to read a few books that we have designated "When I Have Time". The Library continues to add new books to our collection!

THE EVANGELICAL LIBRARY, ENGLAND:

This past month I was introduced to this amazing library in England. Let me introduce it to you. In the 1930's a man by the name of Geoffrey Williams was noticing that good, solid Christian books were slowly disappearing from availability. He didn't want to see this happen so he began collecting books. When he was older, he looked for a place that would take the collection and continue collecting. His work was supported by others including the preacher Martyn Lloyd-Jones. At the time Mr. Williams had collected 25,000 books. Yes, you read this correctly, 25,000 books.

The library is still in existence today. The collection has grown to 80,000 books plus a large collection of periodicals. It is a lending-library for pastors, lectures are presented, etc.

In the article I read about the library, Mr. Williams stated his 3 R's for beginning the collection. Here they are:

- a. The RESTORATION of the word of God at the heart of the Christian community.
- b. The continuing necessity of REFORMING the church which teaches that Word,
- c. And, ultimately, the REVIVAL of the people brought about by a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.
